

Transition Program Agreement Form

I agree to co-enroll in the TruMACC Transition Program through Truman State University (Truman) and Moberly Area Community College (MACC). As a TruMACC participant, I understand that I:

- Will have the opportunity to live on campus in one of Truman State University's residence halls.
- May enroll in 3-6 hours of credit at Truman and 9-12 hours of credit at MACC (not to exceed 18 hours of credit total) per semester. Enrollment beyond 18 hours of credit in a semester must be pre-approved by academic advisors.
- Must participate in a half-day Greyhound Orientation at Moberly Area Community College plus the August orientation day and the Truman Week program at Truman State University during my first term of enrollment in the TruMACC Transition Program.
- Will participate in an advising session with TruMACC co-advisors prior to my first term of enrollment to develop a customized term-by-term TruMACC degree plan.
- Will not be allowed to enroll in or drop a course without approval from TruMACC co-advisors.
- Must enroll in a minimum of one in-seat course each semester at both MACC and Truman.
- Will be responsible for my own transportation between the Truman and MACC campuses.
- Give authorization for my educational records to be shared between MACC and Truman for the purpose
 of advising and evaluation. I understand that the information released will cover my entire academic
 career at these institutions.

In order to remain eligible to continue in the TruMACC program, I am required to:

- Complete at least 6 credit hours at Truman and 18 credit hours at MACC within a twelve month period of enrollment while achieving a 2.75 combined Truman and MACC GPA (excluding dual credit) with no semester grade lower than a "C." (The courses completed must represent appropriate progress toward the degree.)*
- Meet all financial obligations at both institutions.
- Agree to the sharing of financial information between appropriate staff at MACC and Truman.
- Abide by student conduct requirements at both institutions. Serious and/or multiple infractions of the conduct codes of either institution can result in suspension or expulsion from the TruMACC program.
- Be familiar with academic and student affairs policies and procedures at both Truman and MACC (i.e. differing academic calendars, registration processes, business office procedures, etc.).

My signature below indicates that I understand failure to meet any of the requirements stated above will result in loss of eligibility to continue in the TruMACC program.
