PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Co-enrollment Partnership between

Moberly Area Community College (MACC)

and Truman State University (TSU).





The **TruMACC Transition Program** provides students the opportunity to enjoy the four-year college experience while taking advantage of the affordability of community college and the diverse levels of academic preparation it provides.



PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

PROGRAM TIMELINE

While completing Associate of Arts (AA) Degree (years 0-2)...

Moberly Area Community College (Home institution; degree-seeking student)

- Take 9-12 credit hours of coursework per semester
- Complete coursework toward the Associate of Arts (AA) degree
- Can apply Missouri A+ Scholarship Program to cost of attendance
- Can utilize all campus resources

Truman State University (Host institution; non-degree-seeking student)


- Take up to 6 credits of coursework per semester
- Complete coursework counting toward desired major
- Can utilize all campus resources and eligible to live on-campus
- Truman scholarships not available
- Can apply part of FAFSA aid to cost of attendance (Consortium Agreement required)

PROGRAM TIMELINE

After completing Associate of Arts (AA) Degree (years 2-4)...

Truman State University (Home institution; degree-seeking student)

- Take up to 17 credits of coursework per semester
- Complete coursework toward bachelor's degree
- Can utilize all campus resources and eligible to live on-campus
- Transfer student scholarships available
- Can apply any/all FAFSA aid to cost of attendance



COSTS & FINANCIAL AID

Moberly Area Community College

Enrollment Fees

- Fees and tuition costs determined by...
 - o Tier 1 vs. Tier 2 courses
 - In-district vs. out-of-district rates
- In-District rates: \$97-105 per credit hour
- Out-of-District rates: \$185-193 per credit hour
- Tuition and Fees <u>Link</u>

Financial Aid (<u>link</u>)

- Federal aid via FAFSA can apply
- Missouri A+ Scholarship for eligible students
 - A+ cannot pay for MACC textbooks, course fees (eBooks), lab fees, late fees, or Truman courses.

Truman State University

Enrollment Fees

- For Truman courses, you pay the equivalent of the out-of-district Tier 1 cost of MACC courses.
 - \$185-193 per credit hour compared to \$395-759
 - Discount is applied via a "scholarship"

Financial Aid

- Federal aid via FAFSA can apply if student completes the Consortium Agreement.
- Student eligible for the Access Missouri Grant (determined through FAFSA) can receive a \$2,500 housing grant for oncampus housing.

CAMPUS RESOURCES

Students can utilize a mix of resources from MACC and Truman.

Academic advisors from both TSU and MACC work as a team to enroll you in the correct courses.	
Tutoring Services	LARC (Library and Academic Resources Center)

While TSU scholarships are not available, students can apply their FAFSA aid to Truman as well.	Financial Aid available and students may use their Missouri A+ Scholarship for cost of attendance.

- 1. Apply to either MACC and/or Truman
- 2. Complete the TruMACC Application (available online at trumacc.truman.edu)

Already been accepted? Check out our "Accepted Student Checklist" online and on TruView under the "Accepted Student" tab for step-by-step instructions. Some essential steps are:

- 1. Set up your TruView and MyMACC accounts
- 2. Connect with your TruMACC advisors about registering.
 - a. If you want to share financial aid between institutions, complete the Consortium Agreement upon registering.
- 3. Plan to live on-campus? Complete TSU's housing application and deposit.
- 4. Sign up for Summer Orientation.
